## ON After School Programs – Update on Fen. 26<sup>th</sup> meeting:

- Ian updated members on Feb. 26<sup>th</sup> meeting around Ontario After School Programs (OASP). He mentioned that 11 organizations out of 17 were present at the meeting.
- Data is being collected to figure out who is doing what, where programs are being operated in, how many schools and how many children are being served.
- Lee Soda and Ian requested a meeting with Assistant Deputy Minister (ADM) to ask for a 3 year renewal for OASP and to find out what was in the report written 2 years ago on OASP.
